“The Human Resources Manager” (2010) 104 min. Not Rated
(Hebrew, Romanian and English with English subtitles)

A tragi-comedy centered on the human resources manager of Israel's largest industrial bakery, who sets out to save the reputation of his business and prevent the publication of a defamatory article. The film was directed by Eran Riklis and stars Mark Ivanir, Gila Almagor and Reymond Amsalem.

“The Help” (2011) 146 min. Rated PG-13

The film is about a young white woman, Eugenia "Skeeter" Phelan, and her relationship with two black maids during Civil Rights era America in the early 1960s. Skeeter is a journalist who decides to write a controversial book from the point of view of the maids (known as “the Help”), exposing the racism they are faced with as they work for white families. The story takes place in Jackson, Mississippi and stars Emma Stone, Viola Davis, Octavia Spencer, Bryce Dallas Howard, Jessica Chastain, Sissy Spacek, and Mike Vogel.

“Larry Crowne” (2011) 98 min. Rated PG-13

Academy Award® winners Tom Hanks and Julia Roberts are together again for a romantic and optimistic comedy about never being too late to reinvent yourself. When he suddenly finds himself without his long-standing blue-collar job, Larry Crowne (Hanks) enrolls at his local college to start over. While there, he becomes part of an eclectic community of students and develops a crush on his teacher (Roberts). He will discover that when you think everything worth having has passed you by — you just might find a wonderful reason to go forward.
